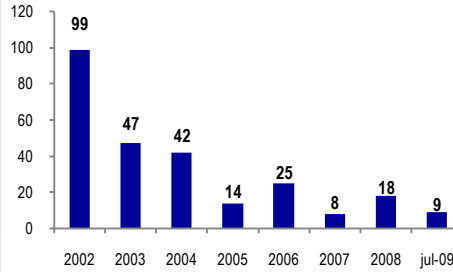

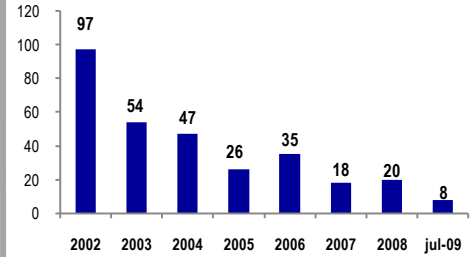

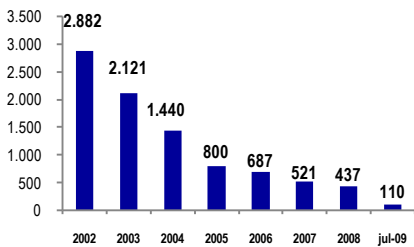
2 REDUCTION OF HOMICIDE OF UNION LEADERS



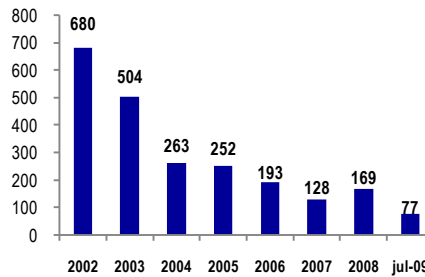
3 REDUCTION OF HOMICIDE OF TEACHERS UNIONIZED MEMBERS



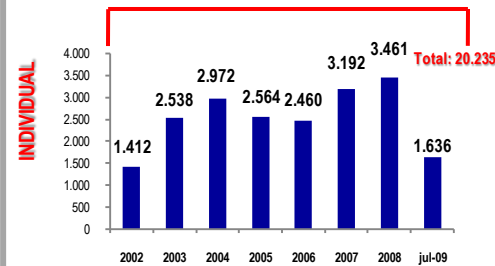

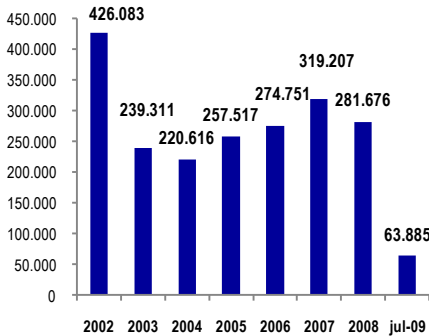

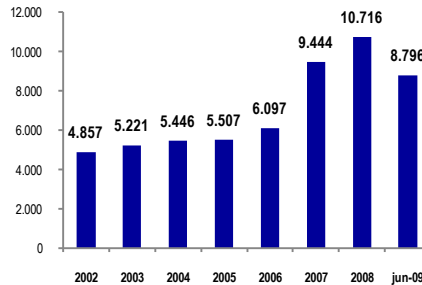


COLLECTIVE: 31,670 AUC members have been demobilized collectively

9 JUSTICE AND PEACE LAW

• Since 2006, more than 30,000 victims have received support from the National Commission for Reparation and Reconciliation.

• 80% of victims do not know the perpetrator and as a result did not have access to judicial reparation. On April 2008 the National Government created a Program for administrative reparation as an alternative that allow them to receive reparation from resources of the National Budget and without a previous judicial decision.

• The Victim Reparation Fund was created by the Justice and Peace Law. It collects assets delivered by individuals or illegal armed groups, resources from the national budget and cash or in-kind donations. As of July - 2009 the value of the Fund is \$ 27.798 million.

10 FOREST – KEEPING FAMILIES



• To July 2009, are 104,315 **Forest – Keeping Families**. Includes actives contracts and graduated families.
